The San Mateo Camping Trip is scheduled for June 20<sup>th</sup> – June 22<sup>th</sup>

We have campsites 95 96 98 102 104 and 105. These campsites are next to each other, 3 on one side of a small field and 3 on the other, giving us a big area in the middle.

To get to San Mateo, take interstate 5, turn off at the Cristianitos exit. Go inland 1 mile and San Mateo Camping Area is on the right side of the road. We can park 2 cars per camping spots for a total of 12 cars and we are allowed 8 people per site for a maximum of 48 people.

The trip is about 50 miles and should take about an hour.

Campfires are allowed in designated areas, unless the forest service decides there is a high fire risk and tells us that fires are not allowed. San Mateo Campground lies a short distance inland from the 3.5-miles of sandy beaches within San Onofre State Beach. A 1.5-mile Nature Trail connects the campground to Trestles Beach, a world class surfing site. San Mateo Creek flows just east of the campground outward towards the ocean creating key riparian and wetland habitats which host some rare and even endangered species. All campsites include a fire pit and picnic table. Other amenities includes a dump-station, hot indoor showers, and flush toilets.
